19-1101 Nabeen Nayak; Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, New Delhi

38-year-old male presented with intermittent colicky abdominal pain, loose motions, and weight loss over a 3-month period. He had similar complaints years earlier for which empirical antitubercular therapy was instituted to which he responded after 9 months. Present colonoscopy showed ileal nodularity, CT enterography revealed thickening and dilatation of lower CBD as well as mild dilated IHBR with prominent ileal folds. HIV Elisa was negative. Jejunal biopsy done.
